

HISTORY CORNER

At the 1927 meeting, the chapter established and "Organ Students Contest" for young people. This was to be held annually.

"The contest has for it's aim, the encouragement of young musicians to study Pipe Organ, and to raise the standards of church playing in the State." Entrance fee was \$1.

"Contestants will not be required to play from memory, but they must arrange their own stop combinations and turn the pages of their music themselves." (Rules for First Annual Organ Students Contest-May 1, 1928.)

The winner was awarded a silver cup.


