November Treasurer's Report

Recently the Executive Board approved a new standard of procedure that requires the Treasurer to report the financial status twice a year, in November and May. With this new ruling, I will include the stats from previous years to allow a frame of reference on our use of funds beginning with the year I was elected Chapter Treasurer.

November 2016

Chapter Operating Fund =\$17,080.52 Scholarship Fund = \$3,622.20

November 2017 Chapter Operating Fund = \$18,207.44 Scholarship Fund = \$3,084.20

November 2018 Chapter Operating Fund = \$13,580.10 Cooper-Miller Money Market = \$3,792.54

November 2019 Chapter Operating Fund = \$8,679.07 Cooper-Miller Money Market =\$4,250.93

November 2020 Chapter Operating Fund = \$11,891.58 Cooper-Miller Money Market = \$3,687.27

In the years where several programs were offered with guest artists, the balance in the Operating Fund reflects this. The Cooper-Miller Fund is expressly used for Scholarships and complimentary membership fees for the winners. This fund has also been used to sponsor POE participants. In 2020, however, those funds were returned to the chapter due to cancellation of the Winston-Salem POE.

Yearly our chapter supports RSCM in July with a \$500 gift. Expenditures also include the annual SmORGANsbord, hymn festivals, Quimby competitions, memorial gifts for long-term members and administration expenses. No officers receive remuneration for their commitment to serving the Chapter.

You may rest assured your membership makes a difference as we reach out to our community and area to promote new organists, the art of liturgy, excellence in music and pipe organ awareness.



Duke Chapel Organist Christopher Jacobson, FRCO, presents a online recital on the Chapel's Flentrop organ. Prepared by J. S. Bach in Leipzig during his final decade (1740-1750), this collection of chorale preludes is an encyclopedia of large-scale works in various styles that Bach perfected throughout his career. Together with the Schübler Chorales, the Orgelbüchlein, and the third book of the Clavierübung, the Leipzig chorales represent the pinnacle of Bach's sacred music for solo organ.

It has come to the attention of the Professional Relations Director that we have churches that do not understand that resumes are for the purview of the appropriate search committee. If confidentiality is critical to you, please make it clear in your cover letter that this is a requirement for you, at least in the initial stages of inquiry and dialogue. If you are seeking a supply organist, the fastest method is to contact the Professional Relations Director with all the pertinent information. When sent to all members by email, many requests are filled within one hour. This method has saved a lot of time otherwise spent in calling an ever-changing list of names.
