ATTENTION STUDENTS 13—18 YEARS OLD: AGO VIRTUAL PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTER JULY 18-23, 2021

This Virtual POE will offer teenagers (13-18 years old) a rewarding opportunity to learn about the pipe organ and its construction, receive instruction from experienced faculty, and meet and interact with peers who share an interest in the King of Instruments.

Here is a quick summary of what will be happening:

Each day around 10:00 AM (ET) we will release four videos that will be your course work for the day. Each video is expected to be no more than 30 minutes in length and covers a specific topic. You will have until 3:00 PM (ET) to view the four videos.

Each day from 3:00 - 5:00 PM (ET) we will have a Q and A with the four presenters that prepared the videos that you watched earlier in the day. In addition to Q and A there will be a Masterclass format that will also offer a variety of learning and instruction experiences with presenters.

Each day at 8:00 PM (ET) there will be a concert program that will be no longer than 45 minutes followed by a "Greet the Performers" Zoom session with the people that just gave the concert. This will be a great time to ask questions and we will also break out into zoom groups to have some good music and social connections.

KATHERINE JOHNSON, ONE OF OUR EARLY COOPER-MILLER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS, IS STUDYING AT OBERLIN CONSERVATORY



In 2012, at the age of 11, Katherine Johnson played for the judges in our chapter's Cooper Miller Scholarship. She was given a small cash award and invited to return again. In 2013, she returned to perform the Bach Toccata and Fugue in G Minor from memory, a piece she purchased with the prior year's money. In 2014, she returned and won our full scholarship.

In 2016, Katherine was awarded the first prize in the high school division of the Albert Schweitzer Organ Competition. She then performed on the Winner's Recital at the 2017 Schweitzer Festival. She has participated in a number of other competitions in the southeastern U.S., including the Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists, the Greater Columbia AGO Competition, and the 2014 ECMAEF competition in Greenville, N.C.

Katherine spent the summer of 2019 working as Organ Teaching Assistant at Interlochen Arts Camp, with Thomas Bara. Her former teachers are Phil Valera, Samantha Koch, and Andrew Scanlon.

Today, Katherine is a junior in the organ department at Oberlin Conservatory, where she studies with Christa Rakich. She is enrolled in Oberlin's double degree program, studying Organ Performance and English.

In addition to her studies, she currently serves as Organist and Music Director at Church of the Redeemer in Lorain, O.H. Prior to taking this position, she worked as Organ Scholar at Plymouth Church UCC in Shaker Heights, and before beginning at Oberlin, as the Cathee Jean Huber Organ Scholar at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Greenville, N.C.

This includes both permanent "open benches" and also onetime "substitute dates." The Guild cannot endorse or recommend any person for a job or substitute date. Membership in the AGO is open to all who pay dues, regardless of education, experience, ability and/or skills. The AGO Professional Relations Director passes along information, which may include salaries offered by institutions and specifics about jobs/dates, as information is received from an institution. AGO members are encouraged to negotiate salaries and explore options with each offered position. The Central North Carolina Chapter, AGO does not accept responsibility for the accuracy of material provided for these listings, nor does inclusion of information in the listings imply endorsement by the chapter.

It has come to the attention of the Professional Relations Director that we have churches that do not understand that resumes are for the purview of the appropriate search committee. If confidentiality is critical to you, please make it clear in your cover letter that this is a requirement for you, at least in the initial stages of inquiry and dialogue.

If you are seeking a supply organist, the fastest method is to contact the Professional Relations Director with all the pertinent information. When sent to all members by email, many requests are filled within one hour. This method has saved a lot of time otherwise spent in calling an ever-changing list of names.
