I'd like to let folks know about a new publication of my organ hymn arrangements in Morningstar's spring catalog.



Christopher Jacobson, FRCO, Chapel Organist and Divinity School Organist at Duke, presents his recital this year on the Chapel's Aeolian organ, exploring inspirational stories and influences behind some of the most profound music of Bach, Max Reger, Healey Willan, Jehan Alain, and Duruflé. Admission is free. Jacobson has presented organ recitals in North America, Europe, and Australia, and records for the Dutch label Pentatone. A GRAMMY-nominated artist in collaboration with the South Dakota Chorale in their recording of Marcel Tyberg's Masses, he has performed the complete organ works of Johann Sebastian Bach and Maurice Duruflé across the United States.

HEINRICH CHRISTENSEN

FEBRUARY 22 AT 7:00 PM

Danish international concert organist Heinrich Christensen will be the performing guest artist on our Sacred Music at the Cathedral series. Mr. Christensen, a prizewinner at the international organ competitions in Odense and Erfurt has given solo recitals on four continents. He will be performing works by Bach, Mozart, and Dupré.

A native of Denmark, Heinrich Christensen came to the US in 1998 and received an Artist Diploma in Organ Performance from the Boston Conservatory, in addition to degrees from conservatories in Denmark and France. He was appointed Music Director of historic King's Chapel in the year 2000, after serving as affiliate organist under the direction of Daniel Pinkham during the final two years of Dr. Pinkham's 42-year tenure at the church.

Heinrich was a prizewinner at the international organ competitions in Odense and Erfurt and has given solo recitals on four continents. He has performed with the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Boston Ballet, Handel & Haydn Society, and numerous choruses in the greater Boston area. He has been a featured performer at regional and national conventions of the American Guild of Organists, and is a former dean of the Boston Chapter.

An avid proponent of contemporary music, he has premiered works by Daniel Pinkham, Carson Cooman, Graham Gordon Ramsay, James Woodman, and several others. He has recorded several organ and choral CDs. and Daniel Pinkham's works for solo voice and organ with Florestan Recital Project.

It has come to the attention of the Professional Relations Director that we have churches that do not understand that resumes are for the purview of the appropriate search committee. If confidentiality is critical to you, please make it clear in your cover letter that this is a requirement for you, at least in the initial stages of inquiry and dialogue.

If you are seeking a supply organist, the fastest method is to contact the Professional Relations Director with all the pertinent information. When sent to all members by email, many requests are filled within one hour. This method has saved a lot of time otherwise spent in calling an ever-changing list of names.
