Getting to Know



Tanner Winchester

Tanner Winchester began his piano studies with Sharon Stricklin (Cinq-Mars) at the age of seven. He continued his piano studies with Dr. Paul Nitsch and Ginger Wyrick, both of Queens University of Charlotte. In 2010, he began studies with Dr. Richard McKee of Campbell University and Dr. Kent Lyman of Meredith College. Because of his studies with Dr. Paul Nitsch, Tanner is a 6th generation Beethoven student.

Tanner is a three-time recipient of the Robert Stigall Organ Scholarship, awarded by the Charlotte Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO), where he studied with Nancy Watson and subsequently with Ginger Wyrick, both of Queens University of Charlotte. Tanner also received additional scholarships from the Durham-Chapel Hill AGO chapter, Charlotte Piano Teachers Forum, Queens University of Charlotte, and other endowments for the arts.

His career as a pianist has included serving as a collaborative pianist for the International Young Artists Project in Monte San Savino, Italy, in 2015, where he collaborated with the faculty of Meredith College and the University of Toledo in presenting performances of Gioachino Rossini's Il Barbiere di Siviglia and Giacomo Puccini's Suor Angelica. During his time with IYAP, he pursued intensive study under Francesco Attesti and Hector Moreno of the Conservatorio di Siena and collaborated with Maestro Federico Bardazzi of Florence and Maestro Paolo Bellocci of Opera di Firenze.

In May 2017, Tanner performed Dan Goeller's work, "In His Own Words," as part of the 500th anniversary of the reformation in Wittenberg, Germany, in collaboration with the choir and orchestra of Colonial Baptist Church, Cary, NC, and The Master's Seminary, Los Angeles, CA.

Tanner is active as a collaborative pianist/organist for churches and schools in North and South Carolina. He also serves as collaborative pianist for musicians in the North Carolina Symphony, the Durham Symphony, The Chamber Orchestra of the Triangle, the Raleigh Flute Choir, and the Union Symphony and has served as accompanist for Theatre Raleigh.

Chorworks Early Music Performances

Friday, June 14, through Sunday, June 16

In association with Duke Chapel Music, the <u>Chorworks</u> summer program brings early-career musicians from across the country to study and perform early music at Duke Chapel. This year's program features the seventeenth-century, English composer Henry Purcell, whose musical voice blends French joie-devivre, Italian drama, and England's long choral tradition. The Chorworks singers and musicians will perform in these public concerts and services, which are free and open to the public:

- Friday, June 14, at 7:30 p.m. in Goodson Chapel—A Program of Sacred and Secular Song
- Saturday, June 15, at 7:30 p.m. in Duke Chapel—Music for Court, Church, and Theater
- Sunday, June 16, at 11:00 a.m. in Duke Chapel—Sunday Morning Worship Service

When sent to all members by email, many requests are filled within one hour. This method has saved a lot of time otherwise spent in calling an ever-changing list of names.
