Raleigh-based organist, pianist, and percussionist *Andy McBeath* is Minister of Music at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church, directing the music program and serving as principal organist. He holds a Bachelor of Music in percussion from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and a Master of Music from NYU Steinhardt.

A versatile performer, Andy has appeared with orchestras, jazz ensembles, musicals, and steel bands, with performances at Merkin Concert Hall, the Chicago Symphony Center, and the Bali Arts Festival. He has studied West-African drumming, Balinese Gamelan, Afro-Cuban percussion, steel pan, and organ, bringing an eclectic perspective to his playing, teaching, and liturgical leadership.

He currently is enjoying renovating his house with his wife Katie, son Malcolm, and dog Piper.

DIANA DALE THOMAS HONORED





On June 1, 2025, Fuquay-Varina United Methodist Church celebrated a milestone few ever reach. Diana Dale Thomas, CAGO, was honored for her 60 years of dedicated service as Lead Accompanist — a role she has faithfully held since 1965. A pillar of the church's music ministry, Diana's steadfast presence at the piano and organ has touched generations of worshippers with beauty, grace, and spiritual depth.

A Magna cum laude graduate of Campbell University in Buies Creek, North Carolina, Diana earned her bachelor's degree in music and went on to become a leader in both church and community music education. She founded and operated the Joyful Sounds Academy of Music & Art in Fuquay-Varina for 31 years, nurturing countless young musicians along their own journeys.

Diana has also held leadership roles beyond the church. She served as President of the Raleigh Piano Teachers Association and maintains active membership in the Music Teachers National Association, the North Carolina Music Teachers Association, and the Central North Carolina Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

This year's celebration echoed an earlier tribute in 2015, when Diana was honored for her 50 years of service with a commissioned choral piece by Pepper Choplin, a renowned composer of sacred music as well as a music fund endowment established in her name.

For her 60th anniversary, another special gift was presented: a commissioned piano hymn arrangement by composer Joseph Martin. Calvin Hughes (pictured above), is one of Diana's music students that took part in the service.

Diana Dale Thomas's life and work stand as a testament to the power of music to uplift, inspire, and bind a community together. Through six decades of faithful accompaniment, she has not only supported worship — she has shaped it.



ALAN MORRISON, head of the organ department at the Curtis Institute of Music, is recognized as one of America's premier concert organists. His performances throughout North America, South America, Europe, and Russia have been received with enthusiastic praise for his quality programming, colorful use of the organ, and interpretive integrity. Reviewers of his numerous recordings have noted that "Alan Morrison knows something about igniting audience passions.... Morrison's playing is consummate and dazzling" (Fanfare) and that he "possesses a technique that could chew holes through solid concrete – and sensitive musicianship to boot" (The Diapason). He will open this season's recital series on the Aeolian organ.





This includes both permanent "open benches" and also one-time "substitute dates." The Guild cannot endorse or recommend any person for a job or substitute date. Membership in the AGO is open to all who pay dues, regardless of education, experience, ability and/or skills. The AGO Professional Relations Director passes along information, which may include salaries offered by institutions and specifics about jobs/ dates, as information is received from an institution. AGO members are encouraged to negotiate salaries and explore options with each offered position. The Central North Carolina Chapter, AGO does not accept responsibility for the accuracy of material provided for these listings, nor does inclusion of information in the listings imply endorsement by the chapter.

It has come to the attention of the Professional Relations Director that we have churches that do not understand that resumes are for the purview of the appropriate search committee. If confidentiality is critical to you, please make it clear in your cover letter that this is a requirement for you, at least in the initial stages of inquiry and dialogue.

If you are seeking a supply organist, the fastest method is to contact the Professional Relations Director with all the pertinent information. When sent to all members by email, many requests are filled within one hour. This method has saved a lot of time otherwise spent in calling an ever-changing list of names.
